SAICM is a policy framework promoting chemical safety around the world...


- Multi-sectoral and multistakeholder

- Builds capacity at country and regional level
- Addresses emerging issues
- Governed by the International Conference on Chemicals Management, guided by a Bureau

**Overall Objective**: Protect human health & the environment from harmful effects of chemicals across their lifecycle by 2020







## ICCM4 Resolution IV/4 (2015): SAICM and the sound management of chemicals & waste beyond 2020

- Noted the value of a voluntary, multi-sectoral & multi-stakeholder approach to mobilize all actors
- Recognized the need to start considering arrangements for the period beyond 2020
- Work is to be informed by the SDGs and resolution 1/5 of UNEA
- Initiated an <u>intersessional process</u>:
  - Between ICCM4 (2015) and ICCM5 (in 2020)
  - Mandated to prepare recommendations regarding SAICM and the sound management of chemicals and waste beyond 2020
  - Open to all stakeholders
  - Process is co-chaired by Brazil and Canada.



#### SAICM OEWG3 – 2-4 April 2019 / a key milestone

- SAICM Open-ended Working Group (OEWG3) to take place 2-4 April 2019, Montevideo
- Key discussion point: Setting the scene for SAICM and the sound management of chemicals and waste beyond 2020.
- Global Chemicals Outlook II and an Independent Evaluation of SAICM will be available.
- Encourage Information Papers from organizations and agencies.
   Request for submissions by 31 January 2019.
- Opportunities for technical briefings and side events to inform delegates.
- High Ambition Alliance launched for Chemical and Waste (Sweden and Uruguay)



Some key objectives stakeholders will be considering beyond 2020:

- i. Minimize or prevent harm from chemicals throughout their lifecycle and waste.
- ii. Generate knowledge, data, information and awareness and have it available and accessible to all to enable informed decisions.
- iii. Issues of global concern are identified, prioritized and addressed.
- iv. Maximize benefits and prevent risks through innovative solutions and forward-thinking.
- v. Importance of sound management of chemicals and waste to achieve sustainable development is recognized by all, actions are accelerated and partnerships established.
